In Layman's Terms

Summer is over and the school year has begun! What a wonderful summer it was, the temperatures didn't get too extreme and it was a wonderful time to be together. That is exactly what the youth group did all summer, we were together!

At the beginning of June, we had a spectacular week with the Broken Arrow Church of Christ at Burnt Cabin Christian Camp where we talked about God's Limitless Qualities, His Power, Creation and Knowledge, His endless love, His eternity, and how He is a part of everything. Through these classes and topics, we grew closer to God and in our understanding of Him. Through silly and strategic Olympic games, we grew closer together with each other and with the Broken Arrow Youth. Camp was a great session!

Then at the end of June, the High Schoolers went on Trek. This is where you go camp and hike up a mountain! We hiked Mount Elbert, the tallest Mountain in Colorado. I've never seen a week full of laughter as much as this one was (I think I'm still sore from all the laughter). We left on Sunday and drove the 12 hours to Colorado. For some of our kids it was the first time to ever see the mountains in person. When we arrived at our host's house, we had a devotional with the youth group there and got to know them a little bit. After that we packed our bags, we got all the sleeping bags, tents, sleeping mats and food we needed for the trip. The next day, we set out for the mountain. We hiked a few miles up that day to our base camp, and it wasn't easy as most of us were already feeling the effects from elevation. But we all made it. Every night we had a devotional and during the day we had quiet times to read and reflect on the glory of God that was all around us in the Rocky Mountains. We were not able to summit, but we made it above 14,000 ft. which was amazing. The view from the mountainside was spectacular. This trip will not soon be forgotten.

In July came VBS, and all summer after BOB/YAE (which I'll talk about later) we practiced our skits for VBS. VBS went great this year. Our youth was a part of every aspect: the opening skits, leading the kids, serving snacks, crafts, puppets, assisting with game time and even the drama room. It's always great to see our youth involved in something that is beneficial for the entire church and not just the youth group.

At the end of July came our mission trip to Jay, Oklahoma. This was our first year to go to Jay so we didn't quite know how it would go, but God has a way of working through everything! The week went amazingly! We used the skits we had practiced all summer to do the opening scenes, and helped with every part of Jay's VBS, from crafts to classes. During the day, we worked on a teen center that was being remodeled for the teens in Jay. It was an awesome endeavor. We cleaned, painted, built and repaired things. It was great to witness our teens serving. On top of that, we made great relations with the people of Jay. The city appreciated us so much that we were put in the Jay/Grove newspaper.

In between big events, we had two weekly events. Band of Brothers/You Are Enough on Tuesday and on Thursday, Work Days. At BOB/YAE we had classes on leadership topics to seeing the value and beauty in ourselves. These are an exciting time for our kids and a time for growth. This summer during our Work Days we focused on the church and helping get things accomplished like cleaning the tables with bleach, moving things for the clothing room, setting up for VBS, assembling shelves and even mowing the lawn. As the youth group, we want to be able to serve in every capacity we can to help our congregation.

This summer was a great one and we want to thank everyone who helped but don't have enough room on the page to do so. So, if you helped with the youth in anyway this summer, know that we all appreciate you so much, and thank you all so much for what you do to help with the growth of our teens!
