To reset something is literally to set it back to its original purpose, its original design. When an electronic device is functioning in a less-than-optimal way, it can be reset so that whatever was stuck gets unstuck and all the connections can run smoothly again. Similarly, when life is functioning in a less-than-optimal way, it can be reset too. This happens first on the inside, where our deep-seated cravings for significance and satisfaction live.

Today our lives are busy, and with busyness, comes distractions and clutter. Through this series you will learn the importance of resetting your life to focus on the important things.

It's easy to give the world its say, to let it bend us and warp us and shape us into a twisted mess. It's easy to conform and just fit in. And if you've tried that a time or two, you don't need anyone to tell you that's no way to live. But God has something better in mind. In Christ, He wants to reset our lives — to transform our minds and our behavior. In Him, we can be made new. That's at the core of Paul's message in Romans 12. We're meant to give up everything in our pursuit of Jesus. In doing so, we resist the things that trip us up and He renews us so that we can embrace the best — God's perfect will.

This coming Wednesday evening, we'll begin our **Summer Series**. We'll have different speakers from area congregations come and deliver lessons each Wednesday night that center around the theme of "Reset." This will be a hope-filled series where we'll learn the importance of resetting our life to focus on the most important things – spiritually, emotionally, and relationally.
